Minor/Certificate Courses

To apply to SPA Major:

1. Complete at least 58 academic hours, including a letter grade of 'C' or better in each of the following courses: English 101 & 102 (or equivalent English 103) – Statistics 211 (or Economics 225) – Psychology 101– Linguistics 101– Course counting toward Physical (Natural) Science–Course counting toward Biological (Life) Science – GEC 3 course –Social/Behavior Science course (normal/abnormal).
2. Complete CSAD 199, Orientation to Speech Pathology and Audiology
3. Receive a B or better in CSAD 200, Introduction to Communication Disorders
4. Receive a B or better in CSAD 270, Effective Public Speaking
5. Receive score of at least 80% on the SPA Qualifying Examination (taken in CSAD 200)
6. Obtain an overall GPA of at least 3.00 (A = 4.0)
7. Complete and submit the CSAD Application online at <http://bit.ly/submit-spa-application> by March 1 deadline
8. Confirm acceptance via Online Acceptance Form (<http://bit.ly/acceptance-form>)

NOTE: Up to 45 students who have fulfilled the requirements and who have the highest cumulative grade point averages will be accepted.

Each student is responsible for:

- Knowing his/her scholastic standing as it relates to the published regulations and standards of the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders within the College of Education and Human Services
- Maintaining the minimum required cumulative GPA (3.00) and CSAD GPA (3.00)
